2014 REVIEW

1. General

The Communist Party was founded in 1920 as the Communist Party of Great Britain and was reestablished in 1988 as the Communist Party of Britain. Its activities are based on the theory and practice of Marxism-Leninism and its organization on democratic centralism combining the democratic participation of the membership with an elected, centralized leadership capable of directing the Party's activities. 3. MEMBERSHIP

2014 2013 Number at 31 December 917 924

Since March 2013 members' dues have been held at the levels agreed at the 52nd Congress in 2012. They are based on members' self-declared gross income.



4. Review of Financial Activities

The deficit for the year was \pounds 7,367 (2013 \pounds 6,730 surplus). With net assets at 31 December 2014 of \pounds 11,028, the underlying financial position of the Party remains sound and the budget for 2015, approved by the Executive Committee in March 2015, is expected to impact favorably on the future financial position.

5a. Activities in the year: extra-parliamentary

The Party organised successful mobilisations for the June 2014 People's Assembly demonstration in central London, the October 2014 TUC 'Britain Needs a Pay Rise' marches in London and Glasgow and the series of protests in solidarity with Gaza in July and August 2014. Special editions of Unity! were also produced on each occasion as well as for the August 2014 anti-NATO demonstration in Newport and the days of co-ordinated industrial action by unions in the public sector (when Party branches were supplied copies for to use at local pickets and demonstrations).

The Party centrally has continued to assist district committees organising local CP involvement in annual national labour movement festivals (Tolpuddle, Burston, Durham Miners and the Chainmakers). This has included the production and distribution of special editions of Unity! bulletins and mobilising teams of comrades to enhance the presence of the Party, the Morning Star and the Country Standard at these events

The Party continues to support the work of trade unions and to win them over to progressive policies. Unity! bulletins were published and distributed at major union conferences. The Party continued to promote the Peoples Charter and support the People's Assembly. Marxist Leninist political education was given prominence with another successful 21st Century Marxism conference and sponsorship of local Communist Universities. Communism amongst young people was encouraged and supported through the work of the Young Communist League (YCL). The Party continues to support the work of the National Assembly of Women.

The Party supports the Morning Star, the world's only English language socialist daily newspaper and continues to deplore the efforts of the mass media, including the BBC, to ignore its existence. The Party and its branches continue to encourage local readers and supporters groups and to hold regular collections for the Fighting Fund. Four editions of the Party's theoretical journal, Communist Review, were published. The Party supports the work of the Marx Memorial Library and jointly organizes with it the annual Marx Oration at Highgate Cemetery.

5b. Activities in the year: electoral

The electoral system in the England, Wales and Scotland starves the Communist Party of media



coverage, effectively fines it for participating in parliamentary and regional elections by the imposition of election deposits and fails to provide the free use of public buildings for public election meetings as required under the Representation of the People Act 1983. These distortions of the electoral process together with press ownership in the UK favors the large established parties, enabling them to rely on mass media to get their message across. While the growth of social media is beginning to undermine this advantage, it still remains intact. Nevertheless, the Communist Party stood six candidates in four separate local authorities in the local government elections in 2014 and supported No2EU in the European Elections, raising £14,468 with an appeal and donating £15,000 to support their campaign.

The Communist Party does not engage in politics in Northern Ireland and encourages communists in Northern Ireland to join the Communist Party of Ireland.

6. International Activities

The Party is part of the international communist and workers party movement, information on which can be found at www.solidnet.org. Priority was again given to solidarity work with the peoples of Palestine, Cuba and Venezuela, to campaigning to oppose further foreign adventures, whether in the Middle East or elsewhere, and to draw attention to and oppose proscriptions against communist parties anywhere in the world including the European Union and Ukraine. Support was given to a number of progressive women's organisations, including the Iraqi Women's League and the Democratic Organisation of Iranian Women.
