Membership

Party Leader, Natalie Bennett

The May 2014 elections were a success, lifting up the number of Members of the European Parliament to three with the election of Molly Scott-Cato in the South West, and an increase in council representation. This also saw a modest boost in media coverage. My focus after the election was on continuing to build local parties and national structures, media profile and membership. In the build up to the general election an ambitious target of standing in 75% of seats in England and Wales was set. The end of the year saw the start of the "green surge" in membership.

Wales Green Party Leader, Pippa Bartolotti

Wales Green Party has experienced an outstanding period of membership growth in 2014. We have employed a Regional Organiser, and focused on standing a full slate of 40 candidates for the General Election. Much progress has been made in setting up Local Parties across Wales, and we now have 14 fully constituted groups. A key focus has been the preparation of candidates for the General Election, in readiness for the Welsh Assembly Election in 2016.

Chair, Richard Mallender

During the past year the party has seen unprecedented growth in membership, rising to around 67,000 at the time of writing. This surge was experienced ahead of the General Election which saw us field more candidates than ever before and with increased fundraising enabled us to campaign more effectively than before.

As party Chair, and registered Treasurer following our Finance Coordinator stepping down early in the year, I have been pleased that we have grown our office capacity with more staff employed under our Campaigns Director and Operations & Fundraising Director, as envisaged on their appointment last year.

Management Co-ordinator, Mark Cridge

We made tremendous progress organisationally in 2014 with the extensive development work that we undertook over the past couple of years really paying dividends.

Most notably the work that was done to improve our membership systems and to actively promote becoming member saw our membership double through the year to over 30,000 paid up members - a process that continued on into 2015.

Digital expertise throughout the party has been greatly enhanced with a high take up by local parties of our bulk email system and membership and supporter tools through CiviCRM.

Over 140 parties updated their local party websites in 2014 and nationally we moved our campaigning sites to a new platform based on Drupal + CiviCRM which will allow us to dramatically improve the quality of our targeted digital campaigns in the future.

2014 has proven the case for digital investment in the Green Party and has set us up for much greater advances in years to come.

Policy, Sam Riches

The Policy Development Co-ordinator (a role which was shared for the final four months of 2014) was assisted by members of Policy Committee to fulfil a number of key functions in policy development, supporting our elected members on policy issues and advising the party response to events. We have also given guidance to members on the preparation of conference motions, and helped to interpret party policy for members of the public, our press team and local councillors. A full-time Policy Officer has been in place since April 2014, assisting with European Election work and then preparing for the General Election

Elections Co-ordinator, Sam Coates

Since taking office in September 2014 I worked on implementing strategic decisions that I had also been party to during the previous months. I liaised with and attended meetings with campaign teams in Brighton Pavilion and in Bristol West, and interviewed applicants for the post of Regional Campaigns Coordinator in Bristol. I briefed staff and worked on plans to deliver the candidates' freepost leaflet scheme, including interviewing applicants for the post of Elections Publications Officer. I set in place strategies for achieving our target of contesting 75% of parliamentary seats in England and Wales. I convened meetings of the election campaign coordinating group, and attended meetings of the manifesto working group.

Internal Communications Co-ordinator, Peter Barnett

I produce Green Activist, an on-line magazine, e-mailed to the membership every 6 weeks. It features a mixture of news, notices, events, articles, reports. It has recently undergone a radical re-design to make it easier to read on-screen with interactive features and links

I handle a large volume of general enquiries from the membership.

I represent the Executive Committee on the editorial board of Green World, the members' quarterly magazine.

Equality & Diversity, Shan Oakes

The Equality and Diversity Committee has organised training sessions at both conferences, and I have been involved in supporting autistic members. We have supported the further development of a Black and Minority Ethnic group. The disability group has been relaunched and is working on a new leaflet and a manifesto for people with disabilities. The Inclusion card has proved successful both at conference and elsewhere. I have attended most GPEX meetings and have recommended that a permanent Equality and Diversity post is introduced at head office because Equality and Diversity is fundamental to the Party and the staffing structure should reflect this.

Donations

During the year the National Party accepted donations greater than £500 from permissible donors (as defined by section 54 of the Act) totalling £329,594 (2013 - £94,530) of which 54 (2013 - 22) were reportable to the Electoral Commission (single or aggregate donations for an individual greater than £1,500 in any calendar year).

Commissions received are earned from the affinity schemes with Good Energy Limited, The Phone Co-op Limited, Environmental Transport Association, Vintage Roots, Ecotricity, Ecology Building Society, Green Energy, Investing Ethically, Recycle 4 Charity and Natural Collection

Financial Review

In 2014 our income has increased dramatically for two reasons; fundraising and membership. Our fundraising donation income increased from £549,192 to £930,100 whilst membership increased from £237,280 to £431,411. Much of the income from fundraising has been driven by proactive election fundraising campaign but also more visionary regular giving campaigns. As our position for funding is established quickly and in a more visionary way more major donors have also decided to get involved – this is of course is greatly helped by increased major donor engagement and the elections. Our membership income has increased due to the increased engagement the party has had with the public over issues such as the leaders debates, and partially driven by the increased engagement in politics from the Scottish Referendum. We have done well to retain members and engage them at the offset which has been greatly enhanced by our efforts to improve systems and engagement processes. In 2015 we would anticipate similar financial growth of the party.

Statement of Registered Treasurer's Responsibilities

The Registered Treasurer is reponsible for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations. The Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000 requires the Registered Treasurer of the Party to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Party and of the surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Registered Treasurer is required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then prepare them consistently;
- make reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, providing details and explanations of any departures in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Party will continue in operations.

Section 41 of the Act requires that the Registered Treasurer is responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Party at that time and to enable him to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Act. Section 45 of the Act requires that the Registered Treasurer is responsible for delivery of the statement of accounts to The Electoral Commission by the required deadline.

Independent Auditors' Report to the Registered Treasurer of The Green Party of England and Wales

We have audited the financial statements of The Green Party of England and Wales for the year ended 31 December 2014 which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet, the Cash Flow Statement and the related notes. These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein and the requirements of the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

This report is made solely to the Registered Treasurer of The Green Party, in accordance with the Party's rules and section 43 of the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the Treasurer those matters we are required to state to him in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Treasurer, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of the Registered Treasurer and auditors

As described in the Statement of Registered Treasurer's Responsibilities, the Treasurer is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view. We are required to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's ethical standards for auditors.

We have been appointed as auditors under section 43 of the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000 in accordance with regulations made under section 44 of that Act. Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with applicable law.

Scope of the audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of: whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Party's circumstances and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed; the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the Treasurer; and the overall presentation of the financial statements.

In addition, we read all the financial and non-financial information in the Report of the Party Officers to identify material inconsistencies with the audited financial statements. If we become aware of any apparent material misstatements or inconsistencies we consider the implications for our report.

1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Statement of Accounts Guidance Notes issued by The Electoral Commission.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements deal solely with the activities of The Green Party. They do not include the income, expenditure, assets or liabilities of the Welsh Green Party or any regional or local Parties since these are constitutionally and organisationally independent.

The financial statements have been drawn up on the going concern basis which the Green Party Executive regards as appropriate due to the continuing support of Party members.

Income recognition

Income is recognised when all of the following conditions have been met:

- The Party is entitled to the assets;
- There is reasonable certainty that the asset will be received; and
- The value of the asset can be measured with reasonable certainty.

Applying these criteria to specific types of income results in the following treatment:

- Donations of monetary assets are recognised in the Income and Expenditure Account on receipt.
- Membership subscriptions are recognised in the income and expenditure account on a cash basis. Membership income shown in the accounts is the total amount of subscriptions before deducting the capitations due to local and regional parties. The Welsh Green Party, like regional parties, is autonomous, but unlike the regional parties is responsible for administering its own membership. Only the amount forwarded by the Welsh Green Party net of capitations is shown as income.
- Interest receivable is recognised in the income and expenditure account on an accruals basis.
- Revenue from the Party's sale of publications and other materials is recognised in the Income and Expenditure Account as the benefit of the goods or services are transferred to the customer.
- Legacy income is included in the income and expenditure account when the legacy has been received or, if earlier, when it becomes reasonably certain that the legacy will be received and its value can be measured with sufficient reliability (for example if advance notification of a distribution is received from the executors).

Website costs

Website development costs are capitalised to the extent that the website will generate a lasting economic benefit to the Party.

Fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off their cost over their expected useful lives, as follows:

Office furniture and equipment - 5 years
Website - 3 years
Computer equipment - 3 years

The Fixed Assets Fund has been established to represent funds tied up in fixed assets. £4,864 has been transferred from the General Fund to represent purchases during the year.

The Greenquest fund exists to provide loans and grants to approved local Party projects. Its income comes from donations and interest received on the balance of funds not loaned which are held in a designated bank account.

12 Operating lease commitments

During the year the Party had annual operating lease commitments on office space to the sum of £33,896. The commitment came to an end in June 2015 and the Party entered a new lease on a new property with an annual rental cost of £18,600. The lease ends in February 2017 but can be broken with 3 months written notice.

13 Related party transactions

£13,827 was reimbursed to a total of 20 individuals who were Executive members or individuals involved with other Committees. The reimbursed expenditure related to travel costs and subsistence.
