Political Report 2014

Throughout 2014 Sinn Fein continued to advance political progress in the North against a backdrop of the Tory/Lib Dem austerity approach while continuing to advance in the South as the main opposition to the Fine Gael/Labour brand of austerity.

We also continued to work to consolidate both the peace and political processes while presenting our alternative to austerity politics in both jurisdictions

Delivering for the people

Throughout the year we led the opposition to the implementation of welfare cuts, in the guise of reform as a symptom of the wider cuts agenda, which has sliced our block grant from Westminster, to the tune of £1.5 billion over the past 5 years in the 6 Counties.

SF was active in advocating our alternative fiscal budget to the Fine Gael/Labour austerity budget. We also actively participated in the wide "Right2Water" campaign against domestic water charges. We also launched proposals around policing and justice reform aimed at tackling GARDA corruption and designated failings in the administration of justice. Furthermore, we also campaigned for political reform, reduction of the voting age, and an extension of franchise in presidential elections to Irish citizens in the 6-counties and our worldwide diaspora.

In the 6-Counties we campaigned for the introduction of the Irish Language Act and against the Tories welfare 'cuts'. On the issue of social rights we continued to highlight issues such as marriage equality and the introduction of a Bill of Rights.

Setting the Agenda

In early 2014 the party launched its European and Local Government election campaigns in both jurisdictions. In the 26 Counties we also unsuccessfully contested a Seanad by-election and Dail by-election.

In a highly successful European election campaign we got three MEPs elected in the 26 counties and one in the 6 counties. An annex is included which gives a factual breakdown of the election results across the 32 counties.

In February we held a very successful Ard Fheis in Wexford town which served as a launch of our Euro election campaign. The national hunger strike march was held in County Fermanagh in August.

For the first time ever, the Oireachtas and Assembly operation held a joint 'away day' in county Louth in September. It was heralded as a successful event well worthy of repeating in future years.

This year also witnessed the emergence of 1916 committees in many counties with a remit to organize fitting events to commemorate the centenary of the 1916 Easter Rising. A national committee was established to both oversee the local committees and organize events at a national level.

Stormont House Agreement (SHA)

The month of December heralded the emergence of another process of negotiations, this time involving the two governments. A comprehensive agenda was put in place involving legacy issues, parades, institutional reform, social welfare, budgetary matters, outstanding commitments etc...

After intense negotiations which went right up to, and indeed past, the two governments deadline, an agreement was put in place at Stormont House. SF was the first party to fully endorse the agreement.

Statement of Treasurer's responsibilities

The treasurer of the Party is required by the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000 to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the Party and of its surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the treasurer is required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it's inappropriate to presume that the party will continue in business.

Section 41 of the Act requires that the Treasurer is responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at anytime the financial position of the party at that time and to enable her to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Act. She is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the party and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Report of the Independent Auditors

To the Treasurer of Sinn Fein

We have audited the financial statements of Sinn Fein for the year ended 31 December 2014 which have been prepared under the accounting policies set out.

Respective responsibilities of the Treasurer and auditors

The responsibilities of the Treasurer for preparing the annual report and financial statements in accordance with the applicable law and Accounting Standards are set out in the Statement of Treasurer's responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the accounting policies. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Overview is not consistent with the financial statements, if the Party has not kept proper accounting records and if we have not received all the information and explanations we required for our audit.

We read the Overview and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it. Our responsibilities do not extend to any other information contained in the annual report

Basis of audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Auditing Standard issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Treasurer in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Party's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.
