Chair's introduction

Sheffield Liberal Democrats ("the party") is a local party, an accounting unit of the The Liberal Democrats (The Federal Party"). The party covers the area of Sheffield City Council, comprising five parliamentary constituencies and part of a sixth. It was formed by merging four local parties on 1 January 2013. The party has nine branches, each covering one or two electoral wards.

Executive structure

The Executive Committee makes decisions about the activities of the party. It comprises the Honorary President; the officers (Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary, Membership Secretary and Policy Officer); the Campaign Manager; representatives of the Councillors; representatives of each branch and of areas where there is no branch, a student representative; the employed staff; and two ordinary members.

Other committees are formed when required, such as for writing a local election manifesto or for selecting candidates.

Staff

was engaged throughout 2014 and 2015 as organiser. He was employed and remunerated by the Federal Party; the party reimbursed that cost to the Federal Party. Details of the transfers made in respect of this are included in note 3.3.

was employed until the end of May 2015 to co-ordinate volunteers and was employed until 7 May 2015 as campaign manager.

Membership

The number of members of the Federal Party who were assigned to the Sheffield local party was 468 on 31 December 2014 and 768 on 31 December 2015. A large number of people joined the party after the General Election.

Accounting units

The party is an accounting unit of the Federal Party. The branches are not separate accounting units. Their income and expenditure is incorporated in the accounts of the party.

Corporate governance and internal control

Decisions are made by the Executive Committee. The officers are elected at the AGM and branch representatives are elected by the branches at their AGMs.

Remuneration of employees is assessed in relation to other comparable positions.

Payments from the bank account have to be authorised by two officers.

The Registered Treasurer is responsible for the party's compliance with the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000, particularly in respect of reporting donations.

External auditors are not usually appointed because the party's annual income and expenditure are usually less than £250,000. Exceptionally in 2015 the expenditure exceeded that limit.

REPORT OF THE PARTY OFFICERS (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015

Review of political activities

Liberal Democrat candidates stood in all six Sheffield parliamentary constituencies at the General Election on 7 May 2015. Nick Clegg was re-elected as MP for Sheffield Hallam.

Local elections for Sheffield City Council took place on the same day. Liberal Democrat candidates stood in all twenty eight wards and won five seats.

Review of financial activities

An exceptionally large amount was spent on campaigning during the year, particularly in connection with the parliamentary election in Sheffield Hallam. Although large donations were received from supporters outside Sheffield in addition to generous support from within the city, expenditure exceeded income by £46,000 resulting in substantially reduced reserves at the year end.

There is not a parliamentary election in 2016. Other than this, there has not been a substantial change since the year end. Income exceeded expenditure to the middle of June 2016 by £8,500.

Statement of Registered Treasurer's responsibilities

The Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000 requires the Registered Treasurer of the party to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the party and of the surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Registered Treasurer is required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates:
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, providing details and explanations of any departures in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the party will continue in business.

Section 41 of the Act requires that the Registered Treasurer is responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the party at that time and to enable him to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Act. Section 43 of the Act requires that the Registered Treasurer is responsible for delivery of the statement of accounts to The Electoral Commission by the required deadline.

The Registered Treasurer is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Party and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Statement of disclosure to auditors

The Registered Treasurer has taken all steps he ought to have taken to make himself aware of any information required by the auditor for the purpose of their audit and to establish that the auditor is aware of that information. The Registered Treasurer is not aware of any relevent information of which the auditor is unaware.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

TO THE REGISTERED TREASURER OF SHEFFIELD LIBERAL DEMOCRATS

We have audited the financial statements of Sheffield Liberal Democrats for the year ended 31 December 2015 which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet, the Cash Flow Statement and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

As explained more fully in the Statement of Registered Treasurer's Responsibilities set out on page 2, the Registered Treasurer is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view. Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

Scope of the audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of: whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the party's circumstances and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed; the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the Registered Treasurer; and the overall presentation of the financial statements. In addition, we read all the financial and non-financial information in the Report of the Party Officers to identify material inconsistencies with the audited financial statements and to identify any information that is apparently materially incorrect based on, or materially inconsistent with, the knowledge acquired by us in the course of performing the audit. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom and reflect those principles contained in the Statement of Accounts Guidance Notes issued by The Electoral Commission.

1.2 Income

Income is recognised when all of the following conditions have been met:

- The party is entitled to the asset;
- There is reasonable certainty that the asset will be received; and
- The value of the asset can be measured with reasonable certainty.

Applying these criteria to specific types of income results in the following treatment:

- Donations of monetary assets and liquid investments are recognised at market value in the income and expenditure account on receipt.
- Grants are recognised in the income and expenditure account when the conditions for receipt have been met.
- Membership and subscription fees that are not in arrears are recognised in the income and expenditure account in the period to which they relate.
- Arrears are only recognised in the income and expenditure account if received before the financial statements are approved.
- Legacies are recognised when the personal representatives of the deceased have notified the party of the legacy, they have obtained grant of representation and there are no significant matters outstanding concerning the precise division of the estate.
- Interest receivable and rental income are recognised in the income and expenditure account on an accruals basis.
- Dividend income is recognised when declared.

1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Office equipment

3 years straight line

Fixtures and fittings

3 years straight line

1.4 Comparative figures

In the previous accounting period under s43(1) of the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000 the Registered Treasurer of the party was not required to have the financial statements audited. Therefore the prior period's financial statements were not subject to audit. The opening balances of the current financial year have however been subject to audit.

2 Income

2.1 Donations

During the year the party accepted donations from permissible donors (as defined by section 54 of the Act) totalling £154,029 (2014: £108,158) of which £122,694 (2014: £94,800) were reportable to the Federal Party.
