#### Introduction

# Review of political activities

#### Overview

2016 was another busy year. The first part of the year was focused on campaigning for the Conservative Party candidate for the Police and Crime Commissioner Election, which took place on 5<sup>th</sup> May. This was followed by the EU Referendum, where the Association remained neutral, but many members were actively engaged in the Remain and Leave campaigns.

In the second half of the year, we concentrated on raising funds, to be spent on campaigning both within the Tatton constituency and across the North West Region. We also contested one by-election to Wilmslow Town Council.

Tatton Association members fully engaged with a series of Cheshire & Wirral Area, and North West Regional, meetings, conferences and events. Members also participated in the Parliamentary Boundary Review consultation process, by attending meetings and by submitting representations to the Boundary Commission for England.

#### Membership

The number of nationally qualifying members had increased to 714 at 31st December 2016, compared with 649 at 31st December 2015. 170 new members were recruited during the year, to replace members who passed away, moved out of the area or declined to renew their subscription. The age profile of the membership continues to be reduced, with more members being actively involved in campaigning and fundraising activities.

During 2016, High Legh branch closed. Dean Row and Handforth branch members agreed to merge, to form a new branch called Bollin Dean. The Executive Council gave approval for the formation of a new branch in Chelford Ward, and acknowledged the closure of the Tatton Women's Lunch Club.

Throughout the year, the branches raised funds for the Conservative Party and carried out campaign work in their geographical area.

The Association also runs a successful Patrons' Club, Team 1000 group and The Portcullis Club for members who wish to subscribe at a higher level. We ran a full programme of events for all three of our donor clubs, in accordance with the benefits offered to members of these groups.

#### Committees

The Association's Executive Council met three times during the year to discuss and approve the work of the Association.

The Management Committee met five times to discuss and agree the detail of the work.

Tatton Women's Committee continued to run fundraising events throughout the year.

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016

#### Campaigning

Our political activities focused on the Police and Crime Commissioner election within Cheshire, and fighting a by-election to Wilmslow Town Council in Wilmslow East ward.

The Association office was used as a coordination hub during the Police and Crime Commission campaign. We administered the postal vote recruitment campaign and the financial appeal, whilst giving full human and financial support to the wider campaign. Unfortunately, we lost the seat to the Labour Party candidate.

Throughout the year, we continued to support other North West constituencies with human and financial resources to bolster their campaign success in local government elections.

#### Staffing

In 2016 there was no change to the staffing of the Accounting Unit. The administration assistant, Wendy Hine, worked two days per week and we continued to benefit from the services of a full time, professional Conservative Party Agent (Hayley Wells-Bradshaw).

During the year, both members of staff helped to train volunteers and newly recruited staff for other Associations, by request.

### 8. Donations

During the year the unit had donations totalling £84,555 (2015 - £65,930) that were reportable to the Electoral Commission, i.e. over £1,500 from the same donor in the year.

Within the Income and Expenditure Account the income relating to these donations is split between the Portcullis Club £54,500 (2015 - £50,250), Event Sponsorship £18,055 (2015 - £Nil), Team 1000 £Nil (2015 - £4,000), Fighting Fund £Nil, (2015 - £10,600), Bequest £2,000 (2015 - £Nil) and other donations (non cash) £10,000 (2015 - £1,080) captions, with other miscellaneous donations below the reporting threshold also being recognised within the Donation and Other Donations non cash captions.

The total donation income included in the Income and Expenditure Account is greater than the figure reported to the Electoral Commission because of donations received below the PPERA reporting threshold.

# INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE TATTON CONSERVATIVE ASSOCIATION
