Review of Financial Activities

Overview

The Alliance Party continues to be in reasonable financial shape. Finances are being managed to ensure cost savings and to allow for financial planning for the future.

Income and Expenditure

Income. Income for the year shows an increase from the previous year and was above budgeted expectations with a small surplus despite having to fight two snap elections outside of the budget.

Expenditure. Regular party expenditure was above budgeted expectations but this was largely met by an income which was also above budgeted expectation due to the snap elections for the Assembly and Westminster.

Balance Sheet

The Party had no overdraft at the 31st December 2017.

¹ For the purpose of compliance with the PPERA, the financial affairs of these groups and organisations within the Party, as well as any newly established groups or organisations, are wholly controlled by the Party Treasurer.

Statement of the Treasurers' Responsibilities

The Treasurers of the party are required by the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000 to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the party and of its surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Treasurers are required to: -

Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently; make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departure disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the party will continue in business.

Section 41 of the Act requires that the Treasurers are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the party at that time and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Act. They are responsible for safeguarding the assets of the party and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities. Section 43 of the Act requires that the registered Treasurers are responsible for delivery of the statement of accounts to the Electoral Commission by the required deadline.

Report of the Independent Auditors

We have audited the financial statements of the Alliance Party of Northern Ireland for the year ended 31 December 2017, set out on pages 10 to 24, which have been prepared under the accounting policies set out on page 21.

This report is made solely to the Treasurers of the Alliance Party of Northern Ireland in accordance with Section 43 of the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the Treasurers those matters we are required to state to them in an auditors report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Treasurers for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of Treasurer and auditors

The responsibilities of the Treasurers for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Auditing Standards are set out in the Statement of Treasurers Responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 21. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Report of the Party Officers is not consistent with the financial statements, if the Party has not kept proper accounting records, or if we have not yet received all the information and explanations we require for our audit.

We read the Report of the Party Officers and consider the implication for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it. Our responsibilities do not extend to any other information contained in the annual report.

Basis of audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes and assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the registered treasurers in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the party's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information n in the financial statements,

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the party's affairs as at 31 December 2017 and of its deficit for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 21 and the requirements of the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000.
