Chairman's report

Since our last meeting, the political landscape locally and nationally has changed significantly. In May 2018 we fought local district and borough ward elections in both Adur and Worthing and whilst colleagues in Adur we were able to hold the status quo, in Worthing (across the East Worthing and West Worthing) council area, we saw gains by our Labour party opponents. It is clear, that the growing coastal migration of residents from the city conurbation of Brighton & Hove is having a significant change in demographics and political views.

In Worthing in the May 2018 elections Labour gained 4 additional seats bringing them to a total of five councillors. Should this trend not be abated then there could be a change in control of Worthing Council affecting the East Worthing area within 3 years. We must garner our energies and rise to this challenge.

During this year we fought a by-election in Adur District Council in St. Mary's ward and despite a determined campaign by our candidate we lost narrowly to Labour. We have also in this period, increased our presence on Lancing Parish Council.

This year has proved challenging, following the legacy bequest reported in the last report, we have been making substantial enquiries into our estate of 88A High Street. It is clear, that years of under investment in the property has left it in a sub-standard condition, that will need swift rectification, not only in physical terms but also in terms of compliance with relevant legislation. On that basis following advice from Conservative central office, we are seeking to refresh our board of trustees and accelerate this work.

Financially we are operating at a small loss per annum, but that can be attributed to the fact that the office we had previously sub-let on the top floor cannot be occupied at this time, until rectification work is undertaken. On a positive note our membership numbers are growing again, with strong signs of younger members joining the association. The association has considered but has yet to review some of its other fees or levy's.

We have under the watchful eye of Dan Humphreys seen the formation of a young Conservative group which can only bode well for the future and should change the dynamics of candidates that we could advance at future elections.

I would like to extend my thanks to the whole team (paid or volunteer) in the office at EWAS who work tirelessly for the association. Equally to all those at ward level who work organising fundraisers and social activities that add so much to the life of the association, including Anne Lock for her work with the 250 club.

Amongst these thanks we should not forget our MP, Mr Tim Loughton and his wife Elizabeth, for their dedication to the association and the constituency. Lets hope as we move pass the 29th March we can bring our focus and energies as a group back to local matters and rise to the challenge of the Labour insurgents.

I would also like to thank Neil Parkin who during this year stepped down from his long-held role as deputy chair political and campaigning, he will be missed. Also, to Ann Bridges who has also stepped down from the fundraising role.

Our next electoral challenge is the Worthing Borough Council elections in May 2019 and for us the four East Worthing wards, some of which are at genuine risk of being lost. I cannot underestimate the challenge ahead of us and as rallying call, ask all members and councillors, to step-up and actively support our candidates. This is a time for passion and energy, fence sitting, thinking it is someone else's problem, is simply not acceptable.

Finally, I would like to offer my thanks to my fellow association officers, I am sorry that I cannot continue in role for another year, but pressures call elsewhere, and I must respond to them

1 Principal accounting policies

The Statement of Accounts have been prepared on the accruals accounting basis and in accordance with the guidance issued by the Electoral Commission - "Accruals accounting for accounting units".

Accounting convention

The Statement of Accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets.

Depreciation

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Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold properties, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Information technology

Over 2 and 5 years straight line

Property

The freehold property was revalued in 2012. It was previously stated at cost. The surplus on revaluation was transferred to the revaluation reserve.

Subscriptions and donations

Subscriptions and donations are accounted for on a receipts basis.

Shoreham Conservative Club

The Shoreham Conservative Club have an obligation to pay an additional 25% of each member's net annual subscription during the year to East Worthing & Shoreham Conservative Association.
