We have 6 very active Branches within the Association in Breaston, Draycott, Ilkeston, Long Eaton, Sandiacre & Risley and Sawley & Wilsthorpe. We also have a thriving ladies Coffee Club in Breaston, which incorporates members from the adjoining parishes and towns. All of the Branches and the Coffee Club have returned to physical meetings but still use zoom meetings for certain business small meetings or in the case of extreme weather conditions during the winter months. They have resumed fund raising activities to a varying degree of success. The Dining Club had a successful year at the Holiday Inn Hotel. Sandiacre with 6 meetings with a very varied number of speakers. However, as the Holiday Inn Hotel would not be available in the Autumn it was agreed to have a years sabbatical and resume in 2023 hopefully, with a new venue. The Erewash Conservative Political Forum did not meet resigning during the year due to the Chairman and secretary retiring due to other political work, however, it is hoped that it will resume again after the local elections in May 2023. An Erewash Young Conservative Group was formed in November 2022 under the able Chairmanship of Chad Fowkes of Cotmanhay and a group of nine members agreed to meet every two months at the Seven Oakes Inn. Two members has already been selected to stand as conservative candidates in the local Erewash Borough Council elections in May 2023. Membership fell from 285 to @250 by the end of the year, not only due to deaths, moving away out of the area etc but on the resignation of the Boris Johnson.

Financial Activities

Income overview

As we did not have any elections during 2022, the Association decided to rebuild up our reserves by having more constituency fund raising events. Commencing with a fabulous Race Night realising over £2,000 profit from the evening in February at the Erewash Valley Golf Club. Overall we held 7 constituency events throughout the year, some of a smaller nature which were still good `earners` and it was generally felt that due to members having to `tighten their belts` under the economic situation, the lower priced events seemed to attract more members. Unfortunately, one major joint event with a neighbouring constituency had to be postponed to March 2023 due to the death of her late HM Queen Elizabeth I1 in September
