This Statement of Accounts uses cash accounting in line with guidance issued by the Electoral Commission. Last year's accounts were prepared on the cash basis. The figures shown for last year have not been recalculated.

## **REVIEW OF POLITICAL ACTIVITIES**

The 2022 local elections were for 16 seats across the 14 Cambridge City Council wards, and one byelection in August 2022 for Trumpington Ward. These elections can be considered a success for the Cambridge Labour Party, with Labour taking 12 of the 16 seats in May, including three gains in East Chesterton, West Chesterton and Newnham Wards. This left Labour with 29 seats out of 42 on Cambridge City Council and a healthy majority with which to continue to pursue our manifesto pledges on addressing inequality, addressing climate change, protecting local services and reducing homelessness. The byelection in Trumpington in August 2022 was held by the Liberal Democrats, and Labour failed to gain this seat, which means that of the 14 City Council Wards, only Trumpington and Queen Edith's do not have a Labour representative

This success was due to strong local campaigning by volunteers and very positive messages to voters in our manifesto and city council report

#### Membership

Full membership at 31 December 2022 was 2034 (2388 in 2021); affiliated supporters 273 and registered supporters 614 (592 in 2021)

#### **REVIEW OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES**

- 1. Total income in 2022 was £83,734.73 (£70,117.68 in 21) and total expenditure £77,751.01 (£75,327.34 in 21)
- Excluding money held in separate branch bank accounts, the CLP made a surplus this year of £5983.72. In 2021 the CLP's deficit was £5209.66. Without a one-off rates rebate of 75% and an NEC grant covering half of our staff costs from June 22, we would have been in deficit again
- 3. .Accumulated current reserves, including funds held in separate branch accounts, total £35,274.84 (£30,059.43 in 21). Branch accounts contain at least £5353.99 (£6122.28 in 21).
- 4. There has been no change in the fixed assets held by the Cambridge CLP. £12,500 has been designated for the costs of a General Election and £3000 for repairs and renewals to the CLP's premises at the **Election**
- 5. The CLP relies heavily on its Guaranteed Income Scheme which, in 2022, raised £14030.50 (less than the £15,687.50 received in 21). A lack of information about the source of donations made via

the Labour Party may mean that this regular income is higher. It is, at present, impossible to get such information from the LP.

- 6. Many members seem reluctant to donate on a regular basis- one factor is that some consider that more of their membership fees should be returned to their local CLP.
- 7. Other sources of funds continue to include part of the 5% allocated by City and County Labour Groups 'for the purposes of effective and vibrant electoral organisation' as required by LP rules. The CLP is suffering from the reduction of this contribution from the County Group, all of whose members represent Cambridge wards and are supported electorally by the Cambridge CLP
- 8. .The CLP is grateful to the city ward branches which contribute up to £2 per member per year to support its campaigning activities. And to their hard working treasurers
- 9. Fundraising has increased post-Covid and huge thanks are due to who ably runs our 100 Club; to who organised a successful dinner (with speaker Anneliese Dodds MP); to who set up an auction of promises; to who and who organised a North Cambridge curry evening (with speaker Mary Joannou and dancer Sujatha Chenilath). Much appreciated; more needed.- good for morale and good for our funds.
- 10. The managed by vice-chair managed, has needed more expenditure in 2022 and it now has a new heating system, a partly re-fitted kitchen, a refurbished office and a vastly improved work space in the main hall. In the main hall has done sterling work sorting out our archives. Hybrid EC and GC meetings are now taking place thanks to managed IT skills and an NEC grant for equipment.
- 11. Cambridge CLP also rents office space in the to a local charity.
- 12. The auditors approved the accounts on 18 February 2023. They noted the importance of generating regular income from sources such as the GIS.
- 13. The serious IT problems experienced by the central LP in 2021 continue to cause problems for many areas of CLP voluntary activity. We look forward to a return of the solid reliable help that was available previously. The LP must provide more training, support and information to its CLP treasurers.
