Review of political activities

Overview

Committees

The Association's Executive Council is responsible for managing the business of the Association and met multiple times during the year. The Association's campaign committee met informally as necessary during the various election campaigns.

Campaigning

The Association's political activities during the year included a vigorous campaign conducted for District elections and the launching of the general election campaign to re-elect a conservative MP for South Cambridgeshire. Campaigning has continued since the local elections with canvassing, newsletters and social media development.

Review of financial activities

Overview

The Association directly financed all its expenses from its own income and reserves. The funds were raised from subscriptions and fundraising events as shown in the accounts.

Income

The main areas of income for the Association were:

- Subscriptions and donations from members and patrons;
- Money raised by branches through social functions and by Association organised events;
- Subscriptions and donations for the associations business club.

Expenditure

The elections for the District Councillors were hard fought and substantial costs were incurred. In addition the general election campaign was launched within the year, and significant campaigning activity undertaken. The results necessitated continuing expenditure and this, together with election costs, resulted in a substantial deficit for the year.
